

Oji Holdings Publishes TNFD Report 2026

Oji Holdings Corporation (CEO: Hiroyuki Isono; Head office: Tokyo) has published its TNFD Report 2026. Since 2024, the company has continuously provided disclosures aligned with the recommendations of the Taskforce on Nature-related Financial Disclosures (TNFD). This report represents a further advancement of those disclosures.

The report presents the Oji Group's approach to managing nature-related risks and opportunities based on the four TNFD pillars: Governance, Strategy, Risk and Impact Management, and Metrics and Targets. In the 2026 edition, the results of analyses of nature-related dependencies, impacts, risks and opportunities, together with the Group's responses and business strategy, have been more systematically organized, and the linkages between initiatives and the transition plan have been clarified. In addition, the report is structured to facilitate a clearer understanding of the Group's response to nature-related issues by distinguishing between analyses and transition plans covering the Oji Group as a whole and analyses and activities undertaken in priority locations.

Disclosure of Responses to Nature-Related Issues and the Transition Plan

The report focuses on forest resources, which have long formed the foundation of the Oji Group's business, and discloses the Group's commitments and targets toward realizing a sustainable society, as well as activities related to supplier engagement, forest biomass business, sustainable packaging, and natural capital accounting.

Disclosure through Group-Wide and Location-Specific Approaches

The first half of the Strategy section presents a group-wide approach covering nature-related dependencies, impacts, risks and opportunities, scenario analysis, and the transition plan across the Oji Group's entire value chain. The second half presents a location-specific approach focusing on CENIBRA in Brazil and company-owned forests in Japan, which have been identified as priority locations for nature-related issues, and discloses analyses and activities reflecting the characteristics of each location.

The Oji Group will continue its nature-positive management based on sustainable forest management and work to achieve both one of the principles of its management philosophy, "Harmony with Nature and Society," and enhanced corporate value, while further strengthening transparent disclosure and engagement with stakeholders.
